

## Make Your 2020 Voting Plan!

Go to [VOTE411.org](https://VOTE411.org) to create your plan today.

- Verify your **voter registration** before the Oct. 5 deadline.
- Determine if you can **vote absentee-by-mail**. If so, request a ballot by Oct. 22. Ballots must be *received* by noon on Election Day. Postmarks don't count!
- In-person **early voting** begins Oct. 6. Verify early voting sites and hours at [vote.indy.gov](https://vote.indy.gov).
- Election Day** is Tuesday, Nov. 3 from 6am-6pm. Which vote center is closest to you? \_\_\_\_\_
- Who is on your ballot? Use the [VOTE411.org](https://VOTE411.org) **candidate guide**.
- How will you **get to the polls**? (Walk, Bus, Drive, Bike, Ride Share, etc.)

## 2020 ELECTION ESSENTIALS

- Sept. 30** **Census response due.**  
Go to [2020census.gov](https://2020census.gov). Census data is confidential and determines how much federal money flows into local communities. (Not counted? Not funded.)
  - Oct. 5** **Voter registration deadline.**  
This is the last chance to register and/or update a name or address change. All voters should verify their registration status! Go to [VOTE411.org](https://VOTE411.org) or call the Marion County Election Board at 317-327-8683.
  - Oct. 6** **Early voting begins.**  
Anyone may vote early and without a reason, but ID is required. The Marion County Election Board Office (i.e., Clerk's Office) opens for voting on Oct. 6. Learn about additional early voting sites at [vote.indy.gov](https://vote.indy.gov). Early voting ends at noon on Nov. 2.
  - Oct. 22** **Absentee-by-mail ballot request deadline.**  
To vote absentee-by-mail, voters must first request a ballot by going to [VOTE411.org](https://VOTE411.org), [IndianaVoters.com](https://IndianaVoters.com), or by calling 317-327-5100. After requesting and then receiving a ballot, the voter may return it by mail. ***The LWV recommends returning ballots by mail no later than Oct. 19.*** Ballots returned after Oct. 19 should be hand-delivered. Delivery locations may be verified at [vote.indy.gov](https://vote.indy.gov). Only the voter, a family member living with the voter, or a voter's attorney are eligible to hand-deliver ballots. All ballots must be received (postmarks don't count!) by noon on Election Day.
  - Nov. 3** **Election Day!**  
Polls are open from 6am to 6pm. Registered Marion County voters may vote at *any* vote center location in the county. Find locations at [vote.indy.gov](https://vote.indy.gov).
